The state's Superintendent of Public Instruction honors the top 10 percent of graduating seniors, as determined by college entrance exam scores and grade point averages. This means over 70 percent of the class of 2018 was in the top 10 percent of Washington seniors.

First Day of School

The first day of school is Tuesday, September 4. School hours are 7:30 a.m. - 2:10 p.m. The doors will open at no later than 7:00 a.m., and students should leave campus by 3:10 pm, if they are not in an extracurricular activity.

Students should come the first day with a pen, a notebook and a 3-ring binder. Faculty will let students know what additional materials will be needed. The second half of the day we will travel to a park for lunch and activities. Students should bring a sack lunch to eat at the park. Students should come to school in dress code.

Dress Code 2018 – 2019

Students are to dress in a Christ-honoring way with neat and modest clothing that reflects their

roles as learners, builds community, and does not distract others from learning. The dress code is a set of guidelines, and it is impossible to be exhaustive; as a result, the principal may address any clothing that distracts from community building. Students may dress up for chapel, and faculty may ask students to dress up for presentations.

Girls' Dress Code

- Girls' collared shirts
- Girls' solid color or conservative pattern fleeces
- Girls' knitted sweaters
- CHS issued sweatshirts
- Blouses
- Modest skirts or dresses, no shorter than the top of the knee.
- Girl's jeans, neat pants or capris coming down past knees.

Boys' Dress Code

- Boys' collared shirts
- Boys' solid color or conservative pattern fleeces
- Boys' knitted sweaters
- CHS issued sweatshirts
- Boys' Neat jeans, khakis, or slacks

Prohibited Items

- T-shirts or non-CHS Sweatshirts
- Any immodesty – midriff showing, tight clothing, exposed straps
- Sweat pants or pajama-like clothing
- Sleeveless clothes
- Hats or hoods over the head
- Torn, tattered, or dirty clothing
- Students are to wear shoes that are not distracting.

P.E. Dress Code

P.E. Attire is to be modest and appropriate clothing for exercise. No sleeveless shirts are permitted at P.E.

The dress code applies at all times while on school premises and during all school functions.
